Snacks with Peanuts:

It’s been a while since we’ve reminded everyone that snacks with peanuts should not be brought to church. This would include snacks that don’t contain peanuts but also snacks that would be processed at the same commercial locations where peanuts are used in other snacks.

For those of us who don’t have allergic reactions, it’s easy to forget how critically dangerous allergies can be. Just this past month a member’s son who was working in his garage suddenly died due to an allergic reaction to a wasp sting. We have members in the church, including Kansas City, who carry an epinephrine auto-injector with them in case a member(s) in their family would accidentally eat food that contain peanuts and suffer from an anaphylactic seizure. Up to 5% of the US population has suffered anaphylaxis which can possibly lead to death in 15 minutes because one’s airways tighten to the point they can’t breathe.

As much as we don’t like to limit the type of snacks we bring, because our children are unaware of foods they shouldn’t eat, we need to be considerate and not bring snacks with peanuts.

Peanuts, which are a legume, are not the same as tree nuts (almonds, cashews, walnuts, etc.), which grow on trees.
