**BIBLE QUIZ – Judges, continued** (Answers below)

- How did Samson destroy the fields of the Philistines, along with their vineyards and olive groves? (*Judges 15:3-5*)
  - He dragged two large trees through the fields, for two entire days without ceasing.
  - He stampeded five thousand cattle through the fields and vineyards until everything was destroyed.
  - He filled fifteen hollow tree logs with locusts, and plugged each end of the logs with the carcasses of thirty lions he had killed. Then he dragged the trees to the Philistine fields and released the locusts.
  - He collected 300 foxes and tied their tails together in pairs. Then he set their tails on fire and released them in the fields.
- What weapon did Samson use to slay one thousand Philistines, according to Judges 15? (*Judges 15:15*)
  - A donkey's jawbone
  - The femur (leg bone) of a lion
  - A large tree branch
  - A scourge (a whip with metal fragments attached to it)
- What was to be Delilah's reward for "selling out" Samson to the Philistine leaders? (*Judges 16:5*)
  - She would receive eleven hundred pieces of silver.
  - She would become one of the king of Philistia's favored wives.
  - She would receive gold and become a concubine of the king.
  - She would receive no reward, but they would spare her life.
- What was the FIRST lie Samson told Delilah, regarding what would cause him to lose his great strength? (*Judges 16:7*)
  - Binding him securely with new ropes.
  - Binding him with seven fresh bowstrings.
  - Weaving his seven locks of hair into a loom.
  - Giving him intoxicating drink.
- How many people were on the roof of the temple when Samson demolished it? (*Judges 16:27*)
  - Five hundred men
  - Six thousand men and women
  - One thousand men, including the leaders of the city
  - Three thousand men and women
- When we were introduced to Micah in Judges 17, what TWO sins was he involved in? (*Judges 17:1-5*)
  - Adultery and false witness (lying)
  - Theft and idolatry
  - Breaking the Sabbath and theft
  - Murder and lying
- When the army of Dan came to Micah's house, what did they take from him? (*Judges 18:17-20*)
  - His mother, his livestock, and some silver
  - His daughter, a visiting priest, and two slaves
  - His livestock, his daughter, and a Levite priest
  - A Levite priest and some idols
- What event led to war between Israel and the tribe of Benjamin? (*20:1-13*)
  - Benjamin's attempt to convince all of Israel to worship the idol, Asherah.
  - An argument over which is superior: peanut butter or jelly.
  - The sexual assault on a Levite's concubine, leading to her death.
  - The tribe of Benjamin was trespassing on lands of two of the other tribes, and ignoring the rulings of the tribal council.
  - The violent murder of a Levite priest.
- Which statement most accurately describes the war that was between the tribes of Benjamin and Israel? (*Judges 20:1-48*)
  - Israel won in the end, but suffered great losses.
  - The Israelites quickly defeated the Benjamites, with few casualties of their own.
  - The Benjamites defeated Israel in four successive battles and the Israelites abandoned the effort when they realized God would not help them.
  - There was only one battle, in which both sides sustained serious losses. After that, the matter was

resolved by the execution of ten men who had been the cause of the hostility.

10. Judges came to a close with what occurrence? (*Judges 21:20-21*)
- The Israelites turning again to idolatry
  - A mass kidnapping of women
  - The execution, by stoning, of a Levite priest
  - The Israelites lamenting their defeat to Benjamin.
  - A scandal regarding the location of the next Hebrew Olympic games.
