BIBLE QUIZ – 2 Samuel, continued (Answers below)

1. When Absalom decided to take the advice of Hushai regarding battle plans, what did Ahithophel do? (*2 Samuel 17:23*)
 - a. Put his affairs in order, then hung himself.
 - b. Took a job with Morton in the Valley of Salt.
 - c. Defected to King David.
 - d. Left Jerusalem and was never seen again.
 - e. Killed Hushai
2. Which one of the following was NOT true concerning the death of Absalom? (*2 Samuel 18:5-15*)
 - a. He had three spears thrust through his heart by Joab.
 - b. He was struck and killed by ten young men.
 - c. He was decapitated.
 - d. His head got caught in a tree, and he was suspended in air.
 - e. David had given an order to “deal gently” with Absalom.
3. Why did Joab rebuke David after they had won the battle over Absalom? (*2 Samuel 19:5-7*)
 - a. Because David danced naked in celebration of the victory.
 - b. Because David had said the Lord was on Absalom's side.
 - c. Because David's soldiers believed David would rather they had died than Absalom.
 - d. Because David had killed the messenger who told him of Absalom's death.
4. When David and his followers were at Mahanaim, a wealthy man named Barzillai provided supplies for them. What was his main reason for refusing David's offer to come to Jerusalem? (*2 Samuel 19:35,37*)
 - a. His wives and family were all satisfied to stay at Mahanaim and he wouldn't leave them.
 - b. He was an old man and wished to be buried with his parents.
 - c. He needed to remain in Mahanaim to keep watch over all of his enterprises there.
 - d. Property taxes in Jerusalem were just too high.

5. All of the following except ONE were true regarding Joab's regaining of his position as commander of the armies. Which one? (*2 Samuel 20:5-22*)

 - b. David knew that if he was going to regain the people's trust he must reappoint Joab to the position.

 - d. Joab spared a city in return for the head of one of David's enemies.

6. When a famine came upon Israel, David asked God why it was happening. God responded that it was because the Gibeonites had not been protected by the house of Saul. What was the outcome of this? (*2 Samuel 21:3-9*)
 - a. David went to the Gibeonites with a large offering of silver, gold, and grain. The famine lasted two more years.
 - b. David argued with God and refused His commandment concerning restitution. As David's punishment, the famine lasted seven more years, and thousands died.
 - c. The Gibeonites requested permanent territory for themselves and an end to their servitude as slaves. King David granted them release as slaves but refused to give them land. As a result, the famine lasted three more years.
 - d. The Gibeonites requested seven of Saul's descendants, whom they executed. After this, the famine ended.
 - e. David agreed to establish "National Gibeonite Week" during which there would be lots of festivities dedicated to recognizing the uniqueness of the Gibeonites. They were all pleased with this, and the famine literally ended overnight.
