Branson Presidents' Day Family Weekend:

The Branson Family Weekend is now only 4 weeks away. The theme for this weekend is "Be found so doing... Staying the course for the long run." This marks the 25th year for the activity. Lots has happened and lots of growth has come, but we still have a distance to go. Come and join us for this fun-filled educational weekend February 14-17 in Branson.

It appears we may have the largest attendance ever. About 60% of the rooms at the Grand Plaza Hotel here already reserved. If we fill the 155 rooms there we have an overflow facility about two blocks away for the same price—but you will have to go a couple of blocks to get where the "action" is. Rooms can be reserved at the Grand Plaza hotel by calling 417-336-6646 and identifying yourself as being part of the Church of God Presidents' Day activity. Cost of rooms is \$50 per night and includes a deluxe hot breakfast each morning.

We will start with a reception on Friday evening, then have seminars Sabbath (and Sunday morning) featuring pastors discussing aspects of the theme. Exact subjects will be available in two weeks. Sabbath afternoon features special Sabbath Services, followed by a catered Barbecue dinner (cost \$12 per adult and \$6 for kids 6-12—you need to send in the meal reservations slip). Then the evening will feature a kids' carnival and family dance.

Sunday will feature more seminars and an afternoon seminar for those who want more. Also in the afternoon we will have activities at Fritz's Adventure (\$8/person), Branson's Wild World (\$5/person). Games and swimming are also available. Sunday evening we will have a free pizza party and game night.

We need volunteers to help with the events. Please check the sign-up sheets on the table for volunteering to help in various areas, as well as to bring goodies or other items for the opening evening reception.

BIBLE QUIZ – 2 Chronicles (Answers below)

1. Which of the following best describes the reason for the kingdom’s division after the death of Solomon?
(2 Chronicles 10:1-19)
